

remained the same over the dozen years we have been in business."

That focus, Colin reveals, is on maintaining the 'just-picked freshness' of his customer's temperature-sensitive cargo throughout the journey. "The Detour Logistics fleet currently counts 60 reefers, most of which are B-doubles. We only choose equipment that will ensure we have the most reliable reefers on the road," he says. "For our refrigeration units, we have recently discovered that Mitsubishi Pegasus systems are the best option."

Colin says the main contributor to his discovery was one of the original Mitsubishi trailer units that he had fitted seven years ago, with its 'outstanding performance' and the Detour team, so the reliability of the refrigeration systems is not only important for consistent temperature. but consistent performance with minimal unplanned downtime. "We have the systems set up with QTRS on a regular servicing maintenance contract as well as the Mitsi-Track telematics system with 24/7 monitoring," Colin says. "Now, we don't have to worry about the refrigeration systems at all, and we can concentrate on the other aspects of the business." According to QTRS, that holistic refrigeration offering is what the Melbourne-based service provider prides itself on, having joined in a partnership with Mitsubishi Heavy Industries Japan to supply, install and maintain



prompting the MD to fit 16 more of the Pegasus systems across the Detour Logistics fleet this year. "We've had no issues with them at all, the reliability is second to none," Colin says. "The fridges pull down quickly and maintain a constant temperature, which is what is required to keep the produce at the height of freshness."

Although only fitted to a selection of the fleet so far, Colin says the long-term goal is to change every refrigerated trailer to the Mitsubishi systems, with the help of Mitsubishi refrigeration service provider, Quality Transport Refrigeration Services (QTRS). "We're incredibly happy with the systems and will spec them for all new equipment we add to the fleet," Colin mentions. "The team at QTRS in Melbourne have been really helpful in choosing the right system to meet our needs, and help us meet the needs of our customers."

As well as maintaining the freshness of the cargo, the on-time delivery of goods is of paramount importance to Colin Mitsubishi refrigeration units for trucks and trailers in the Australian market.
